<sup>2</sup> Shared access:	A shared resource or network share is a device or piece of information on a computer that can be remotely accessed from another computer, typically via a local area network or an enterprise Intranet, transparently as if it were a resource in the local machine.
<sup>3</sup> FTE:	Full-time equivalent enrollment was calculated as full-time plus one-third part-time.
<sup>4</sup> On campus:	Is defined as institutionally-owned, -controlled, or -affiliated housing.
